- Senior Studio Prerequisites:** Passed entry review & completed three classes from Menu II. You may not take both Senior Studio requirements in the same semester.
- Graduation Requirements:** Grades of "C" or better are required for all CVAD requirements. Additional graduation requirements include: 42 hours must be advanced; 24 of the 42 advanced hours must be completed at UNT. Must have a 2.0 GPA (UNT & overall) and a 2.5 GPA within the major. Students are encouraged to run their [online degree audit](#) regularly to track the completion of all requirements for this degree.

Entry Portfolio Review Information:

Students interested in pursuing a major in Studio Art begin as pre-majors. Entry reviews are conducted electronically using the UNT portal for the submission of application materials, [UNT SlideRoom](#), during each long semester, with deadlines of **October 15** and **March 15**. No late portfolios are accepted.

To be eligible for entry portfolio review, students must have earned 30 or more hours of college credit with a **cumulative GPA of 2.50 or higher** and grades of “C” or higher in the following courses:

- ART 1600: Foundations: Perception & Translation
- ART 1700: Foundations: Space
- ART 1800: Foundations: Narrative & Representation
- ART 1900: Foundations: Systems & Transformations
- ASTU 2401 Beginning Metalsmithing or ASTU 2402 Beginning Jewelry (minimum grade “B” or higher)
- 6 additional hours of 2000-level or higher Studio Art (ASTU) courses

All courses above must be completed in full (not in progress) to meet eligibility. Students who are not admitted may review again, in accordance with established review deadlines. Students must meet eligibility requirements and review for all concentrations they intend to pursue; pursuing additional concentrations may delay time to degree completion and is not recommended.
